EXECUTIVE DIRECTORS/STAFF REPORT/CAPITAL PROJECTS UPDTAES

- Staff went to the NDRPA and WPRD and Community Builders won an award for Water World.
- Evolution Sports Complex
 - They are doing all underground work currently.
- Muni expansion-
 - This project is moving forward, waiting on bid pack 1 for vertical.
 - Working on scopes of the pump house.

Sept 22, 2026

- The water recuse line pipe was delayed, it is here now and work will start soon.
- Holes 10-15 are nearly fully shaped, and crews are coming in to work on the driving range.
- Irrigation work is about to start, and the site demo is getting prepared.
- The clubhouse design was reduced by approximately 3,000 square feet, saving an estimated \$1.8 million while maintaining operational and community needs.
- RFCC/WARC renovation projects
 - FCI and JLG are under contract, working with them to identify the first phase and design of RFCC.
 - Working through what is the most cost effective for the HVAC system for the RFCC due to spacing.
 - The WARC project is scoped into the RFCC project but will have to look through budget at this time.
- SLP overlook paving
 - This project has been completed.
- Western Star fastpitch complex
 - Working on a fundraising packet.
 - Need to identify what the cost of this project will be.
 - First phase to turf field 6 and get grandstands.
- Water World
 - The parking lot project was completed.

OLD BUSINESS

- Potential Parkland Acquisition Discussion
 - Parcel:01-269-00-00-31-220
 - Parcel: 01-269-00-00-31-210
 - Status quo as of right now the acquisition for the land is still not signed by the judge.

- Williston water world parking lot cost- share and project closeout proposal- discussion/board direction
 - Community Builders proposed paying their portion of the parking lot and transferring remaining Water World funds to WPRD in exchange for ending the 2022 MOU.
 - This agreement was based off of funding and costs that are no longer valid at this time.
 - If the board discusses and agrees to the new contract, then there will be a motion at the next park board to approve it. If not approved, then WPRD would have to pay their portion of the parking lot.
- Working through ideas to not just let them out of the contract WPRD can create a new MOU so that they are still tied into a partnership, but it does release them from funding so that they can move forward with new projects.
